These are some of the collaborative efforts we at the Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sports very much welcome and would like to see more and more of. We hope through the FBBA's network, we can bring forward more companies to put together initiatives that will benefit the community.

Another potential area of interest is in the youth development. Through the Youth Development Centre, for instance, we hope to address the issue of unemployment especially amongst our youths. The private sector can

certainly contribute and we welcome FBBA-linked businesses to extend a helping hand.

The Government of His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, in this regard, is planning to set up another Youth Development Centre at Kampong Bukit Pasir, in the Tutong District. As our youth is the future of the country, we hope that FBBA through its member companies can help in training our youth especially in the field of oil and gas related industries, which will be the main focus for this new center. These are just some of the examples where we can explore together, but there are certainly more.

To conclude, let me once again thank the French-Bruneian Business Association for this opportunity for me to share my thoughts on potential areas of cooperation. In saying that, I would like to thank you all for the many contributions you have made thus far in not just bringing businesses together, but also to bring our two communities closer.
